Hello,






JIM PATTERSON was down for over a week with a bad sinus infection and cold after Borrego Springs... glad you are back up and running, Jim!



BAKED FRENCH TOAST WITH STREUSEL TOPPING

INGREDIENTS:

<u>1 loaf French bread</u>, cut or torn into small cubes, you can do this a day or two ahead and keep in a plastic bag or container with a lid. It is ok if it dries out a little bit. 2 1/2 cups milk 6 large eggs 1/2 cup granulated sugar 1 tbls. vanilla extract 1 tsp. cinnamon

Grease a 13 x 9 inch pan, spread bread cubes evenly in pan.

In a bowl whisk together the milk, eggs, sugar, vanilla and cinnamon. Pour egg mixture slowly over bread. You may need to press down the bread cubes after you pour a little mixture over them. You may also mix the bread cubes into the egg, milk mixture and then pour everything into the greased pan. Let sit while you prepare the streusel topping.

STREUSSEL TOPPING: (I double the topping because I like a little more topping)

1/4 cup cold butter 1/4 cup light brown sugar 1/4 cup flour 1/8 tsp. cinnamon pinch of salt

In bowl combine all ingredients, mix together with your hands until you have a crumbly mixture. Sprinkle over top of bread mixture.

Bake 350 degrees for 30 to 40 minutes or until set and top is lightly brown.

Serve with syrup and butter if desired.

You can prepare this the night before. Just cover with plastic wrap and refrigerate until morning. You may need to allow a little more time for baking.






