By the numbers: There were 2,292 Family RV's, 352 Commercial RV's, for a total of 2,644 in attendance. Educational attendees: RV Basics 175, RV Driving School 69, RV Backing School 25. First-Timers 866 (which represented almost 38% of the attendance), Towables 30, total Exhibitors 418. There were many seminars and crafts to attend.

The evening entertainment was outstanding. It started out on Wednesday night with comedian and FMCA member *Jim Pelley*, who lives in northern Calif. Jim, previously a writer for Saturday Night Live, brought loads of laughs to the audience. Thursday was the Chapter Block Party where over 570 members joined many chapters. Friday, we saw
