Indio Rally January 9 – 13, 2019 Volunteers Needed

Once again, the California Coasters have stepped up to volunteer to drive the six-passenger Express Tram (golf carts) to assist FMCA members get around the Riverside County Fair Grounds during the 31st Annual Western Area Rally in Indio, CA.

Having five 6-passenger trams in service requires about 65 volunteers to drive two or three 3-hour shifts during the four-day rally. To meet this requirement, we have partnered with the Monaco Romers Chapter (Romers) to help us meet the need for volunteers. The benefit that we and the Romers receive is that we both get to park close to the venues on asphalt with 30 Amp electrical hookups during the Rally. We are usually located next to the new and almost new RV display area.

Let's mark your calendars and plan to go to the Indio Rally and join in on the "Once Upon a Time" festivities that include socializing with your California Coaster friends, RV related seminars, new and used RV displays, sale of RV equipment & supplies, free coffee and donuts, participating in the "Once Upon a Time" Parade, ice cream social and food booths. Sign up to attend the Rally and volunteer to help out by taking your turn as a volunteer golf cart driver to help fellow FMCA members get from one place to another on the vast Riverside County Fair Grounds.

All you need to do is sign up with FMCA and the California Coasters to attend the Rally and email George Brodt at gbrodt@earthlink.net, or call George at (661) 904-7083, to say that you and your wife (significant other) would like to help out as volunteer golf cart drivers. Volunteers also get to participate in the free volunteer dinner on Tuesday evening and get two-nights of free parking at the fairgrounds on Monday and Tuesday nights (worth \$ 50.00). Since we are arriving at the fairgrounds on Sunday, January 6th, the volunteer coaches will only have to pay the \$ 25.00 early arrival fee for Sunday night. In addition to these benefits, we have gotten feedback from many volunteer drivers that they enjoy talking to fellow FMCA members during their short ride and feel good about helping people get around the fair grounds.

Report on the WMHA Corporate Board of Directors Annual Meeting and Pre-Indio Planning Session Tuesday, September 25, 2018 in Hanford, CA

Chapter Director, Randy Gibbs, and National Director, George Brodt, represented the California Coasters at the annual meeting of the WMHA and the Pre-Indio Planning Session. All Western Area Chapter Presidents and National Directors are Board members. Our President, Leroy Davis, asked Randy to represent and vote for him at the annual meeting during the morning session and Co-Captains for the Express Trams, Randy and George, participated in the Pre-Indio Planning session in the afternoon.

President, Lon Cross, called the meeting to order at 8:30 am. Sixteen Western Area (State of California) chapters were represented at the meeting. Fifteen chapters and five Executive Board members are required for a quorum. Following the Pledge of Allegiance, invocation and introductions, Secretary, Carol Hazeltine, distributed a hard copy of the Secretary's report and stated that the minutes for last year's meeting were also published on the Western Area's web site (wafmca.com). The Secretary's report was approved without revision. The Western Area web site is a great resource since they publish many chapter newsletters and also have the sign-up sheets and other information for the Indio Rally.

Treasurer, Kurt Simon, distributed hard copies of the WMHA Treasurer's Report dated, September 25, 2018, and the Proposed 2019 Budget to the annual meeting participants. He reported that the WMHA was in good shape financially, with \$ 240,463 cash in Wells Fargo checking and savings accounts. He also reported that he is looking into other banking institutions that offer higher interest rates on savings accounts.

The main activity of the WMHA is the Indio Rally and the income and expenses for the rally dominate the budget. The 2018 rally had 808 attendees and the bottom line was that the WMHA lost \$ 31,791. This coming year the Executive Board is trying to attract more vendors, and with increased participation from towable RV's, we are anticipating and budgeting for 875 RV's for the 2019 rally. The treasurer also reported that the executive board has authorized an expenditure of \$ 10,400 for marketing through digital media to increase the participation for the 2019 rally. The 2018 rally had a profit of \$18,483, however, after including administrative expenses the rally lost \$ 31,791. The complete treasurers report for the 2018 rally will be available to the members at our October rally in Pismo Beach and the December rally in Paso Robles.

For the 2019 "Once Upon a Time" rally, the Executive Board is planning on 875 registrations, which will result in a loss of \$ 3,817, however, they are expecting that there will be more than 875 participants, which could eliminate the deficit. It appears that the deficit is largely the result of the Executive Board's decision to spend \$ 10,400 on marketing (on line advertising) to increase attendance at the 2019 rally. The treasurer's report for 2018 and the proposed budget for 2019 were approved without revision.

Senior Vice President, Bob Gault, reported that the planning efforts for the Indio rally were going well and that he would like to thank all of the officers and Captains that have stepped up to make the 2019 rally a success. They are working hard to attract more vendors by attending other organization's rallies and inviting their vendors to start off the 2019 New Year by renting a booth at the Indio Rally. It was pointed out that vendors only have to pay \$ 260 to rent a 10' by 12' booth at our rally.

Central Vice President, Fred Wells, gave a brief summary of his interaction with the chapters located in the central part of California. He reported that he and his wife have visited six chapters and they are planning to visit four more before the end of the year.

Alice Bernard, Membership Chairperson, stated that she is available to chapter membership officers to help them recruit new members. She said that she gets a monthly report from FMCA in Cincinnati of new members that is broken down by Zip Codes included in WMHA's Northern, Central and Southern regions. Chapter Membership officers could use this resource to contact new FMCA members in their respective areas to see if the new members would be interested attending a chapter rally as a visitor to determine if they would be interested in joining the chapter. Alice also said that the "First Timers" meeting in Indio will be followed immediately by a Chapter Fair in an adjoining room. Usually, there are 250 to 300 new members at the First Timers meeting. She encouraged all chapters to sign-up and reserve a table for the Chapter Fair. Randy and I thought that this was a good idea, so we made a reservation for the California Coasters to have a table at the Chapter Fair.

Following a lunch catered by Subway, the Indio Rally Pre-Planning session began. Vice Presidents met with their respective Indio Captains to finalize their needs lists with regard to equipment and supplies. We requested five 6-passenger golf carts and one 4-passenger golf cart, six radios and signs for the Express Trams. Our schedule for the four-day rally requires about 55 volunteers to fill 110 three-hour shifts. We typically ask each volunteer to drive two shifts during the four-day rally. Fortunately, our friends in the Monaco Romers Chapter partner with the California Coasters to provide the number of volunteers required to fill the schedule. Volunteers get to park on the asphalt with 30 Amp electrical hookups instead of in a dirt lot, two pre-rally nights for free (worth \$50.00), and an invitation to the volunteer recognition dinner on Tuesday night.

We also met with the Arrival Area Captain, James McDaniel, and the Parking Captain, Rob Kenly, to plan the California Coasters pre-rally arrival on Sunday, January 6, 2019. In order for us to be in the first row of the Brown Lot, we need to be ready to be escorted in as a group at 11:00 am. To ensure that we are all there at 11:00 am, we should plan on getting to the arrival area between 10:00 – 10:45 am. The Monaco Romers will be in the second row and will be escorted in at noon and the Beavers will be in the third row and will be escorted in at 1:00 pm.

The meeting was adjourned at 2:30 pm.
