





- 6 Slices Bacon, cut in pieces
- 1 Cup Onion, chopped
- 1 Clove Garlic, chopped
- 1 ½ Pound Ground Beef
- 2 Large Cans of Tomatoes (diced or whole)

Sauté Onion, Green Bell Pepper, & Garlic in the Bacon Drippings
Until Tender. Add Ground Beef & Cook until Lightly Browned.
Add Tomatoes, Salt, Pepper & Chili Powder. Pour Into Large Pot,
Cover & Simmer 30 Minutes. Add Vegetables & Simmer 15 minutes longer.
Sprinkle With Bacon (I add it to the Stew) Serve with Garlic French Bread
Can Be Simmered as long as you want! If you want it juicier add V8 juice.

Beverly Gee's famous Chile Fritos Salad

(1) 120z bag of frozen corn (I always add a little more than that). Thawed (2) cups grated cheddar cheese —one green pepper diced—1/2 cup finely chopped red onions—one cup of mayonnaise— you can mix this in advance the day before or hours before—then right before you're getting ready to serve it you add one bag, 10 and half ounce bag Chili Fritos—and you can crush them in the bag—just a little so they're not so big.—(remember-has to be CHILI FRITOS) -toss right before serving-delish—let me know how it goes. Serves about 10 to 12 people maybe a little more depending on how big a scoop they take.


