### President's Message



Hello to All,

The 96<sup>th</sup> FMCA Convention, held in Indianapolis, Indiana, is now history and all who attended had a great time. There were 1,477 family units, and 247 display coaches for a grand total of 1,724. It did rain a couple of times and some had to be relocated. Local residents told me that they hadn't seen this kind of rainy weather in over 20 years.

The following is the Governing Board Activity Report:

The Governing Board concluded their meeting with the following decisions:

Bylaws Amendment Proposals

Proposal 1: Same F# cannot serve on the Executive Board concurrently: Failed

Proposal 2: Concerning non-discrimination definition of membership: Failed

Proposal 3: Towables: Passed. This proposal will now be submitted to the total membership for their approval in FMC Sept., Oct., & Nov. magazine. The results of the vote will be known by early December.

Policy and Procedure Amendment Proposals

P&P #1016: Streamline awards notification process. Passed.

P&P #1017: Revise initial year member dues and clarify categories for Suppliers. Referred back to Committee. P&P #1018: Generalize usage and materials for FMCA emblems. ?

P&P #2005: Proviso...Concerning members serving on Exec Board with same F#. Failed because Bylaws proposal 1 failed. P&P #3010: Proviso... Concerning non-discrimination definition of membership. Failed because Bylaws proposal 2 failed.

Clerical changes were made to the following P&Ps:

#2000, #2028, #3001, #3023/A, #2031, #3011/C, and #4000.

The following is the Governing Board's newly crafted working definition of "Towables:"

"A self-contained wheeled vehicle that includes permanently installed cooking, sleeping and sanitary facilities."


