FMCA News:

FMCA Headlines this past month have been either COVID-19 or the budget. Mostly it's been about the 2021 budget and the heavy losses in membership and revenue. On June 5, 2020, the Executive Board (includes me) passed a budget that consisted of keeping the FMCAssist program, adding a \$10 FMCA liability insurance assessment charge to every RV that attends any Area Rally and keeping the dues at \$75 per year - these were just some of the heavy hitters. Well, the budget was passed but it also resulted in a \$230,000 deficit. Passing a budget having a deficit has actually happened twice in FMCA and as recently as October, 2011. We took this action based on the voting results of the Minot Governing Board and survey information we had in hand at the time of our voting.

Well, the Executive Board has gone back to the drawing board, and we've been working on a budget correction. Based on President Walker's letter dated 7/13/2020 the write-in comments have been about two to one in favor of dropping the Assist Benefit and reducing the dues to \$50. Of course the budget would be balanced with a small surplus. There sure was a lot of folks on both sides of the Assist benefit fence who wanted it gone to save FMCA from failure or wanted it as an important benefit to our RVing members. We will continue to keep you informed.

WHMA News:

It is with great disappointment that we must announce that the WMHA Executive Board has decided to cancel our upcoming 33rd Western Area Rally, which was scheduled for January 6-12, 2021. There were just too many obstacles to overcome. The fairgrounds are being used as a federal medical station. Indio is one of two such stations in the state. We found the earliest the feds are planning to leave would be December 31, 2020, and only if there wasn't a spike in new cases. With only 3 days to prepare for our rally and having to work within CA and CDC COVID guidelines it was just too much for us to handle at this time. The health and safety of our members must be first and foremost. The good news is that the Rally is being postponed until January 12-16, 2022. The theme remains the same...*In The Land Of Oz.*

The new WMHA Executive Board was installed on June 23, 2020, during a two-day WMHA Executive Board meeting via Zoom. A letter was sent out earlier to all chapters announcing the new officers. They are: WMHA Senior VP, Dave Franke; Secretary, Carole Hazeltine; Treasurer, Dale

Ford; Northern VP, James McDaniel; Central VP, Rick Ammerman: Southern VP, Jesse Bassford. Bob Golk was elected in May as the new Western Area President and on August 29, 2020, will be installed as the new FMCA National Vice President of the Western Area. Congratulations to all of the new officers.

believe in our American way of life, with all its frailties. Wars end, politicians come and go, viruses will be controlled and social unrest will both change things and also be a thing of history.


